



Status of State Safety Oversight Program Certification for Minnesota

 On October 11, 2017, U.S. Transportation Secretary Elaine L. Chao announced that Minnesota is the second of 30 states to receive FTA certification for its <u>State Safety</u> <u>Oversight (SSO) Program</u>.



Transit Asset Management (TAM)

Transit Asset Management (TAM) is a business model that uses the condition of assets to guide the prioritization of funding at transit properties in order to keep our transit networks in a State of Good Repair.


